William Wayne Martin, 84, of Charlotte, NC, died May 17, 2020, under the care of Liberty Hospice at the Royal Park of Matthews Rehabilitation and Health Center.

Wayne, as he was more commonly called, was born in Albany, Georgia, on September 8, 1935, the only child of William Pitt and Bonnie Grace Hines Martin. He grew up in Vienna and graduated from Vienna High School before enrolling in Young Harris Jr College in Young Harris, Georgia. Wayne went on to attend the University of Georgia where he obtained his BA and ultimately his MBA in Accounting.

After honoring his country with service in the United States Army and gifted with a talent for numbers, Wayne went to work for Price Waterhouse and then ultimately Marsh and McLennan in Charlotte, NC.

A native Georgian, Wayne was born a fan of dogs and he owned many in his lifetime, though he never owned a bulldog, the namesake of his alma mater. Wayne was also a fan of film, especially the classics, musicals and Disney films. He had quite the collection on VHS that he had even copied over from older formats. Most of all, though, Wayne loved to spend time with friends and family and he will be missed by all who knew him.

Wayne is survived by his wife of over 49 years, Mrs. Dame Rodgers Martin whom he met at a Myers Park Methodist Singles Event and married on April 17, 1971. He is also survived by his daughter, Angelyn (husband Corey) Boucher of Charlotte and their children: Austin, Lukas and Addison. Wayne is further survived by his church family at St. Michael Anglican Church and his fraternity brothers in Sigma Chi. He was preceded in death by his parents and his 10 year old son, Michael Wayne.

Wayne's family has given the family of Lowe-Neddo Funeral Home the privilege of caring for him and for them.
