



Anthony "Tony" Barrera

Anthony (Tony) Barrera was born in Lyons, Kansas in 1964. His family moved to Malibu, California when he was in elementary school. He would eventually meet his future bride (Nancy Ann Enger) of almost 25 years in junior high school. Tony loved baseball and filmmaking while growing up in Malibu with his mother (Loretta Barrera), father (Joe Barrera) and his brothers and sisters (Yole, Jesse, Pillar and Bert). He began cooking when he was a young teenager at Trancas restaurant, and would become known in later years for his incredible culinary talents and generosity helping others learn to cook. Nancy and Tony re-met in Malibu and immediately became kindred spirits in the fall of 1987; they moved to Santa Barbara the following February. They were married in Cane Garden Bay, British Virgin Islands on a sailboat called, "Island Time" in June 1990 with Nancy's parents (Bill & Laurie Enger) and sister (Kristen Enger VanEngelen) along with Tony's sister Yole; Tony cut fresh orchids from the surrounding beaches for Nancy's bouquet. Nancy and Tony moved on, eventually settled in Boise, Idaho with their two boys, William (Dakota) and Casey. His boys were the pride of his life – and he couldn't be more proud of them each and every day. Tony died in Charlotte, NC while on contract with TekSystems and Wells Fargo. He loved being a Customer Experience/Interaction Designer, and thought the world of his company and team. He was scheduled to return to Idaho for the holidays to be with his family, but died on Tuesday, November 18 before he could return. His legacy is one of a tremendous work ethic, a loving husband and father and loyal

friend to all.
