June 21, 1942 - January 27, 2015

Beebe Stanfield Barksdale, 72, of Charlotte, passed away on Tuesday, January 27, 2015 at home with her family by her side. Beebe is survived by her loving husband Bevo Barksdale of 48 years, and son Butch Barksdale, both of Charlotte. She is also survived by her aunt, Jane Rogers of Roxboro, NC. Beebe was preceded in death by her parents, Louis Bedford Stanfield and Esther Bruner Stanfield and a sister Susie Stanfield Taylor.

Mrs. Barksdale was born on June 21, 1942 in Raleigh, NC and grew up loving the arts and eventually became an accomplished writer and poet. She graduated from UNC Greensboro with a BA in Arts and obtained a Master Degree in Fine Arts at Queen's College in Poetry. She published a book titled *It Comes To Me Loosely Woven* in 2007. Her talents also included drawing, painting, clay, and photography with her works being displayed throughout the years in numerous locations and magazines.
