“ When we were kids, my brother, Rick, and I, stayed with Belveia and her family for a couple of weeks one summer when our Mom and Dad attended a convention. I was a 14-year-old teenager. Belveia agreed to allow one of my friends to spend the night with me, there in her home. Being teenagers, we snuck out of the house that night after everyone had gone to bed to meet up with several of our friends 1/2 block down the street at the corner. As we were sneaking back into the house just before sunrise, she caught us, red-handed, in the kitchen. She didn't angrily yell at us... just expressed her deep disappointment in us and our behavior (which, honestly, was worse than being yelled at.). I begged her the next day to please please not tell my parents. (I knew they'd 'ground' me forever.) Her response, "I won't tell them, but I expect YOU to tell them." Nothing more was ever said about it.

Forty years later, in a conversation with her and my mom one afternoon, I brought that incident up, laughing about it, and was horrified, at that moment, to realize that my mother knew NOTHING of it. Of course, I had to fully confess right then. Belveia called me over to her, hugged me tight, and said, "I'm SO proud of you... I always had faith that you'd come clean with your mom.
