Benjamin Bruce "Ben" Elliott, 86, of Indian Trail, North Carolina, went home to his family on Wednesday, April 3, 2019, with his earthly family at his side. 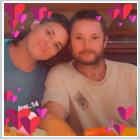

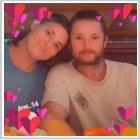

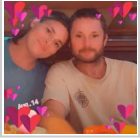
