Charles David Evans, born January 20, 1944, in Brooklyn, New York, passed away leaving behind a legacy of service, hard work, and love for his family. He was the son of Fred Evans and Johnnie Belle Evans.

Charles was drafted into the United States Army on September 6, 1967, and served in Korea until his honorable discharge on September 5, 1973. Upon returning to New York, he began building a life rooted in family and dedication. He married Sadie Duggins, the mother of his children, who preceded him in death.

For more than 30 years, Charles worked as a Transformer Mechanic lineman for Con-Edison, a career marked by skill and perseverance. His work motto was respect, accountability, and mind your business.
