Charles “Buck” Boyce Wallace, 89, of Mint Hill, died Thursday, February 9, 2017, at the Clear Creek Nursing and Rehabilitation Center.

Buck was born in Lancaster County, South Carolina, on June 16, 1927, the son of Charlie Herbert Wallace and Pearl Kathleen Brooks. His family moved to North Carolina where he grew up in Anson County before ultimately moving to Mint Hill. He worked with Rodeway Express and Johnson Motor Lines before later going to work for the Town of Mint Hill doing general maintenance and helping Randy at Pinkston’s Lawnmower Service after Johnson Motor Lines shut down.

On November 21, 1953, he married Monnie Peterson in York, South Carolina. Together they were blessed with three children. Buck had many loves in life. Buck was also a NASCAR nut, enjoyed gardening, working outside and though a good honest man, loved playing a joke or two on folks.
