Edward Victor Stines, 69, of Mint Hill, NC, died June 4, 2016. Through the love and care of his family and hospice, he was able to be at home with his family at his side.

Eddie was born in Charlotte, NC, on November 4, 1946, the son of Clent Edward Stines and Helen Hucks Stines. A 1965 graduate of Garinger High in Charlotte, Eddie was inducted into the US Army and faithfully served in the 9th Infantry Division in Vietnam before being honorably discharged in 1968. 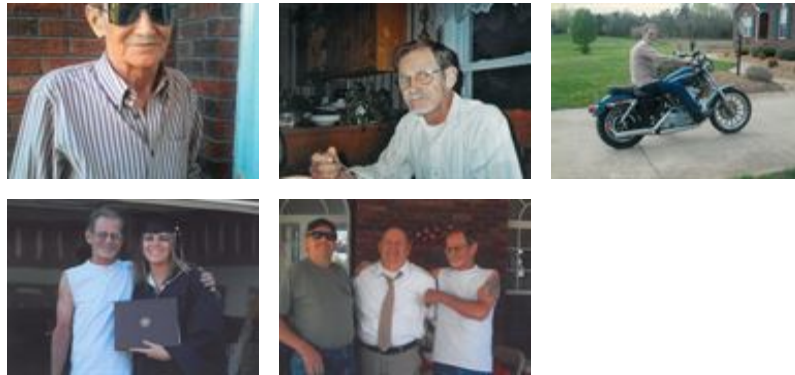
