James Durwood Morrison, Jr, 90, of Charlotte, died Tuesday, April 5, 2016, at CMC in Pineville.

James was born in Statesville, NC, on November 11, 1925, the son of James Durwood Morrison, Sr. and Mary Troutman Morrison. He answered his country's call to service during World War II and honorably served in the United States Marine Corps. James went on to graduate from Lenoir Rhyne College, majoring in Music & Education. He began his teaching career in 1951 in Spartanburg, SC. He later moved to Charlotte and taught at A.G. Jr. High & West Mecklenburg High School where he taught Choral Music from 1954 until 1990.

James also enjoyed serving the Lord and using his musical talents to do so. He was the Minister of Music at Park Rd. Baptist Church from 1954 to 1976. In addition he also served with the following parishes: Steele Creek Presbyterian Church, Living Savior Lutheran Church, Wedgewood American Baptist Church, and First Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, Statesville, NC. Not limited to serving churches, James also used his talents for the benefit of his community. He served as chorus master for the Charlotte Opera Association in the 1960's as well as also being a Water Safety Instructor and lifeguard at public and private pools in Statesville, Spartanburg, Hickory and Charlotte. His passion later in life was travelling with his wife, Celeste. James' life was about serving others and using his musical talents, but what he most loved was the time spent with family and friends. He will be sadly missed and fondly remembered by all who knew him.

James is survived by: son Chad Morrison & wife Lisa of Vero Beach, Florida; daughter Amy Owenby & husband Paul of Glendive, MT; stepson John Needy & wife Nancy of Spartaburg, SC; stepdaughter Carol Scovel & husband Terry of Charlotte, NC; stepson Bill Needy & wife Karen of Chattam, VA; grandchildren: Allie Morrison, Will & Micky Owenby, Elizabeth Geddes, Stephen Needy, Barry Scovel and wife Heather, Kim Schermerhorn, and Holly Needy. He was preceded in death by his wife, Celeste; a daughter, Patricia Bishop and sister, Maryhelen Morrison.

Services honoring James will be held at 10 am on Friday, April 8, 2016, at Southpark Christian Church, 6650 Park South Drive, Charlotte. Inurnment will follow in the church columbarium.

I had the privilege of knowing J.D. both through Park Road Baptist and as a teacher at A.G. He, more than anyone else, is responsible for my love of music and my own singing through my lifetime. His leadership of choirs at Park Road planted the seeds for a music program that bloomed under his tutelage and has continued to be part of the church's heart ever since. I was blessed to be part of that program as a child and youth, and to return to it for much of my adult life. Part of J.D.'s ministry that wasn't mentioned was his ministry to youth and children. One of my first memories of him was pitching kickball for playtime for the children's choir. Later on, his putting on the Gilbert and Sullivan musicals with the teen choir made for several special summers.

His teaching was also special – and his pastoral skills showed there as well. He was the chorus teacher at AG for two years when I was there. His calming words to the choir after one of its members committed suicide (at age 14) were so meaningful to many of us.
