May 2, 1944 - May 15, 2023

Jane Piper, 79, of Mint Hill, died peacefully in her sleep at her home on May 15, 2023.

Jane was born in Virginia Beach, VA, on May 2, 1944, the daughter of David Hughbanks and Marjorie Moore. She grew up between Virginia Beach and Baltimore, graduating from Towson High School. Jane worked in the hospitality industry and as a seamstress before deciding to go back to school. She then attended Norfolk State University and earned her degree in accounting when she was 40. Jane went to work for the federal government where she worked primarily for the Army Corps of Engineers and US Border Patrol. She further pursued her education, obtaining a masters degree in contract procurement and management from Golden Gate University.

While in Virginia Beach, she met a sailor named Terry Draper. She lost the bet, he won big, and dating a sailor paid off for her as they celebrated 37 years of partnership. In July of 2004, they moved to Mint Hill where they had been residents ever since.

When not working, Jane enjoyed fashion, entertaining and rescuing cats.

Jane is survived by her husband, Terry; a sister Sue Ellen; a brother, Albert; and a brother Graden. She is further survived by numerous other relatives and

friends. Jane was preceded in death by her parents; a brother, Bill.
