Jean Claire Reischman was born May 30, 1929, in Cleveland, Ohio. She went to be with our Lord Jesus Christ on November 29, 2019, at Tucker Hospice House in Kannapolis, North Carolina.

Jean was born to Earnest A. Gabor, from Budapest, Hungary and his wife, Betty Marie Gabor from Cleveland, Ohio. She was very intelligent and musically inclined as a child and young adult. She was first chair violinist while attending Marymount High School in Cleveland. Jean attended Ohio State University, majoring in Early Childhood Education. Jean graduated OSU with honors. She met her future husband of fifty-four years, Paul Reischman, at Ohio State University. She earned her master's degree and was an award-winning teacher and principal for many years.

Jean married Paul Lewis Reischman on June 6, 1953 at Our Lady of Peace Catholic Church in Cleveland. Jean officially retired from McAlpine Elementary School in Charlotte, NC, and focused her attention on her ten grandchildren, and five great grandchildren, with two more expected soon.

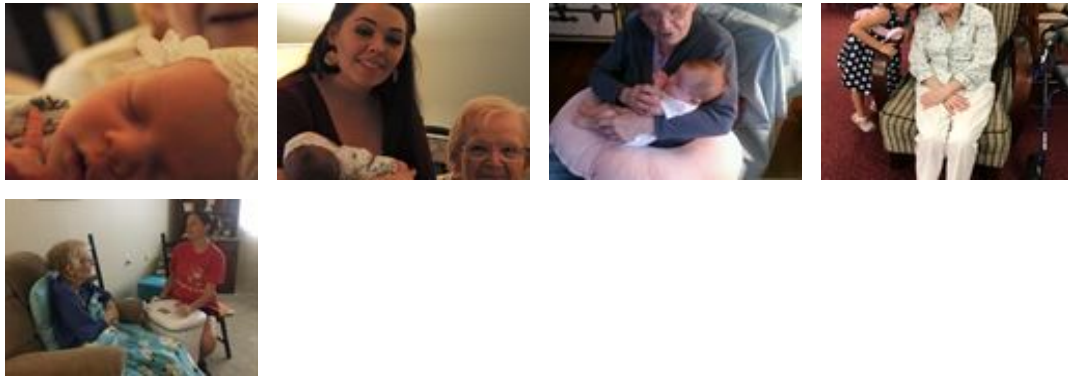
