



Lynn Gomon Gebara

July 16, 1940 - April 9, 2024

Lynn Gomon Gebara, 83, a longtime resident of Highland, California, died peacefully on April 9, 2024, surrounded by her family.

Lynn was born July 16, 1940, in Norfolk, Nebraska, and raised by her parents, Horace W Gomon, a newspaper editor, and Marjorie Gomon, an English teacher. Lynn was an excellent student and an accomplished violinist. She was selected “The Milestone Girl” as the outstanding young woman of her Norfolk High School graduating Class of 1958. Lynn went on to attend the University of Nebraska where she was a member of the Delta Gamma sorority, graduating with a bachelor of arts degree in 1962.

After university, Lynn married James T. Gebara, an officer in the United States Air Force. She spent the next 15 years raising her two sons, moving frequently to military postings in seven states. Settling in California in 1977, Lynn trained as a respiratory therapist and attended patients at San Bernardino Community Hospital for 25 years.

In retirement, Lynn enjoyed arts and crafts hobbies and made beautiful artwork. She was active in P.E.O., a philanthropic organization for women, the Embroiderers Guild of America, and other organizations. Lynn was also a lifelong fan of the Nebraska Cornhuskers. No autumn Saturday afternoon passed without a “Go Big Red” message from Lynn. In the last year of her life,

Lynn moved to Charlotte, North Carolina, to live with her son. She loved the beautiful blossoms of the southern springtime, and appreciated the friendliness and hospitality of the local people in North Carolina.

Lynn is survived by her sons: Joseph C. Gebara of Charlotte, and Lt Gen Andrew J Gebara (wife Dr. Nikki Gebara) of Washington, DC; her brother, COL. (ret.) Charles W. Gomon of Monterey, CA; three grandchildren and three great grandchildren. She is further survived by numerous other family and friends. Lynn was preceded in death by her parents.
