“ *I remember Marjorie Martin so very well....she lived just up the street from me in Symerton. My mother taught her in grade school and often talked about the Martin girls. I have books that she and her sisters, Mary Fran and Rachel read. After they were grown and I was desperate for books (no library in Symerton), her mom, Agnes, gave me many of them.....girls books from the 1920s and 1930s. I loved them and reread them many times (If daughters or granddaughters would like to read things like 'The Yellow Quill Girl,' let me know.)*

I also still have a ring with a huge purple stone (cheap, but I loved it) that Marjorie gave me when I was about 8. I remember her saying that she thought I'd like to wear it.

I remember her sisters and her parents....and a little bulldog (I think that's what it was) that her mom had. I love the picture - it's how i remember her.
