Like the time you and he hiked up to Pepson's and found all those old ancient farm implements back in the woods. He has good memories of you. I'm sure Lynn does too but I can't get them out of him. Scotty and I talk on the phone a lot. This past year Diane and I went to PA to stay at her folks place. It was in October. We visited Bob & Dawna and Uncle Gerry & Aunt Loretta. We saw Little Gerry and Cheryl too (and her husband Kevin). Everyone had a nice word about you. The one thing in common was that they just couldn't believe you were gone. All of us struggle with that. You should know though, that our Aunt Dawna died this past November and Uncle Bob died this month. It was very very sad. I think Bob died of a broken heart. But Uncle Gerry and Aunt Loretta are doing really good so we still have some elder family left with us. Remember that canoe trip on Lake Norman when we tipped it over and fell into the lake? We laughed so hard and long about that. It was hot out and we needed cooling off anyhow. We had fun with Mom and Masue in the mountains when the 4 of us hauled the canoe up there for a beautiful autumn trip too didn't we?. How about that time you and I went to the drag races for your first time? I'll never forget the look on your face when you saw your first dragster spit fire and smoke while roaring down the track. You pumped your fist after that. It was great wasn't it?. And what about that hike from the western side of the Sierra Nevada mountain range to the eastern side with Dad in August of 1970? You weren't quite 13 yet. We made it to the top of the highest peak in the lower forty eight states. Pretty awesome accomplishment eh? All the people all over this earth who lose a loved one, in whatever way, it just really hurts. Once the life is gone, there's no getting it back.

Randy, I love you and miss you. Your whole family and all of your friends do too. I guess all I can do now is continue to have those little "air" conversations with you.

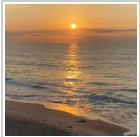

“ I guess I didn't realize that I had it all planned out. Subconsciously I had the notion that I was going to keep going on double dates with uncle Randy and aunt Crystal, we were going to watch football together, and I was going to visit them both in Charleston once they retired and finally got the rest and relaxation they worked so hard for.
