Tracy A. Davis, 56, of Charlotte, passed away on April 9, 2026, at Novant Health in Mint Hill, North Carolina. His life began in New York City on April 21, 1969, where he was born at St Luke's Hospital to Esau German and Ellen Davis, and from the very start he carried the unmistakable energy and spirit of the city that raised him.

Tracy grew up in Harlem, surrounded by family, friends, and the rhythm of a neighborhood that shaped his humor, his resilience, and his love for people. He had a natural talent in the kitchen and spent part of his career working as a sous chef, a role that fit him well—he loved good food, good company, and the joy that came from bringing people together.

In 2011, Tracy made the decision to move to North Carolina to be closer to his sister, a choice that reflected the deep loyalty and love he held for his family. Charlotte quickly became home, and he built a life filled with connection and community.

Tracy enjoyed music, socializing, and going out with friends—he was at his best when he was laughing, telling stories, or simply being in the company of people he cared about. Those who knew him will remember his easy smile, his warmth, and the way he could make any room feel lighter just by being in it.

He leaves behind family and friends who will miss him deeply and carry his memory forward with love.

He is survived by his daughter, Shannah; grandchildren, Nazir and Amiyah; his father, Esau; a sister, Sheri; and a brother, Sayquan. Tracy is further survived by his siblings from his father's side as well as numerous nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends. He was preceded in death by his mother.

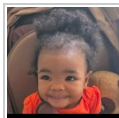
